Protect Our Waterways

We all know that April showers bring May flowers...but what happens when all that rainwater falls on our homes, businesses, and other hard surfaces? It can become polluted if it comes into contact with automotive oils, garbage, sediment, pet waste, or lawn chemicals.

Gunpowder Valley Conservancy (GVC) invites you to grow clean water by participating in our <u>Clear Creeks Project</u>, which now covers the entire Gunpowder Watershed!




Here are a few ways to get started with GVC's Clear Creeks Project

- Attend a FREE native plant workshop: Learn about the benefits of adding native plants to your home garden. Join us as we finish installing a <u>Bayscape in Glen Arm</u> (Saturday, May 31 at 10 am), <u>Bayscape in Timonium</u> (Saturday, June 14 at 10 am), or <u>Rain Garden in Parkville</u> (Saturday, June 14 at 10 am). No gardening experience necessary!
- Let us know you'd like a garden assessment: Fill out a brief form
 to be considered for a Clear Creeks Project conservation garden. We
 currently have a wait list but look forward to connecting with you as
 soon as possible to discuss ways to promote clean water at your
 home.
- Got rain? Need Barrel?: We are finalizing a couple rain barrel
 workshops this summer. Rain barrels are an easy way to reduce
 stormwater runoff on your property. Best of all, if you live in the
 Gunpowder Watershed, each barrel only costs \$75 (including PVC
 elbow for downspout). Fill out our interest form and we will notify you
 of upcoming rain barrel workshops and sales.
- Train to become a GVC Stream Captain: Each year, GVC volunteer leaders help remove hundreds of pounds of trash from our local waterways. Join us on <u>Saturday</u>, <u>June 7th for our next "Adopt-a-Stream" workshop</u>. Learn best practices for leading volunteers in a stream clean-up, how to identify stream hazards, and get matched with a stream segment.

Coordinated by Gunpowder Valley Conservancy, the Clear Creeks Project is a grant-funded, citizen-based initiative that helps answer a community desire to restore the water quality of the Gunpowder Watershed. Additional funding provided by the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation; Chesapeake Bay Trust; Baltimore County Department of Environmental Protection and Sustainability; and Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Trust Fund, administered by Maryland Department of Natural Resources.
