**David** is our **Stream Programs Assistant.** As an undergraduate at the University of Lynchburg, he collaborated with Maryland DNR and Trout Unlimited on a project to add Tiger Trout eggs into a stream near Westminster, MD. This data could help inform whether Brook Trout can be reintroduced to areas that have previously been impacted by stream degradation. He has also spent many summers collecting water quality data from Leesville Lake and the Pigg River.

Brody is our Forest Stewardship Technician. After receiving his Bachelor's in Ethnobotany from Frostburg State University, he has been traveling the country working on farms, studying permaculture design and herbalism, and expanding his knowledge of plant communities. He's also a licensed arborist focusing on tree preservation. Rumor has it he's a Hereford High School graduate (!), so we're happy to have Brody back in his home watershed after his exciting travels.
