You Raised \$33,000 for 33 Years!




Goal reached. Match complete. What a way to head into the new year!!

Read our 2021 Annual Report and see why GVC board members believe our local forests and streams are a precious resource.


Discussing Our Shared Vision

GVC staff spent their Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. holiday giving back to their local communities and beyond. GVC Communications Manager, Amy Young, recruited her husband to remove several bags of trash--including rusted car parts--from a local stream within the Lower Gunpowder Falls area. She submitted the total pounds of trash removed to Baltimore County's Clean Green 15 Challenge so that Seven Oaks Elementary School can get credit towards an environmental project grant.

Other GVC staff volunteered with the Friends of Jug Bay Wetlands Sanctuary and Zooniverse, an online tool that enables volunteers to contribute to large-scale research projects.
