Successful Spring for GVC

Proud to be a 2024 Grant Recipient!






Spring is usually our busy season for field work. This spring is no exception as Gunpowder Valley Conservancy (GVC) has **recently been awarded two grants totaling \$60,000** to expand our work as a land trust and watershed restoration nonprofit.

GVC was fortunate to receive awards from two different tracks within the <u>Keep Maryland Beautiful grant program</u>. One project will add 600 native trees to a pollinator farm in Reisterstown, which had lost a substantial number of ash trees due to emerald ash borer in recent years. The other project will enable GVC to focus on expanding capacity building for our land preservation work. Stay tuned for updates later this year!

The Keep Maryland Beautiful grant program awarded \$236,276 for environmental education, community cleanup, and beautification projects. This grant program is funded by the Maryland Environmental Trust, Maryland Department of Transportation, Maryland Department of Agriculture, and the Chesapeake Bay Trust.

Working together to reduce water pollution, one yard at a time! Last week, GVC celebrated World Water Day with about 20 McCormick employees at their Technical Auxiliary Center in Hunt Valley.
