Successful Stream Clean-Ups



What can one person *really* do to make a difference? Here's some math to inspire you! Since September 4th, our volunteers have **removed** approximately 1,960 pounds of trash from our waterways through 139 hours of hands-on work! A total of 55 volunteers, including employees from a local business and students from CCBC, have helped make this effort possible. They removed several pieces of major debris, including a grill, a bike, four shopping cars, a granite tabletop, and IKEA furniture.

We are deeply grateful for the energy and commitment of everyone who has hosted or attended a stream clean-up this fall, and we look forward to seeing what you can accomplish in 2026!
